ORDER

In these cases, arising out of letter petitions, the primary issue relates to compliance of relevant law of environment by M/s Vikram Stone Crusher and M/s Dinesh Rori Udyog situated at village Koliya.

The State Pollution Control Board was directed to file a report after inspection of the site. Accordingly, the Board has filed a compliance report along with the report on basis of inspection conducted on 19.01.2020. As per the

compliance report, the Regional Officer of the PCB, Kishangarh, Ajmer, Rajasthan has deposed as under:

*“4) That in compliance of the directions passed by this Hon’ble Tribunal, the officials of the State Board have conducted inspections of both the stone crushers namely M/s Vikram Stone Crusher and M/s Dinesh Rodi Udhog situated at village Kolia on 19.01.2002. During inspection it was observed that both the units have provided adequate air pollution control measures in accordance to the norms prescribed under EP Act, 1986 and complied with consent conditions. The photo copy of the inspection reports dated 19.01.2020 along with photographs are annexed herewith and marked as **Annexure-R/1 (Collectively)**.*

*5. That the State Board officials have also conducted Air & Noise monitoring of both the stone crushers. The Analysis results of Air and Noise monitoring of both the units found within prescribed limit. The photo copy of the Air & Noise monitoring analysis results are annexed herewith and marked as **Annexure-R/2 (Collectively)**.”*

In view of the aforesaid report, after inspection by the PCB, we are of the view that nothing further remains to be adjudicated in this matter. However, the PCB is directed to have periodical inspection, at least once in three months, to ensure that the aforesaid stone crushers do not violate any of the relevant laws. In case any violation of law, the State PCB shall immediately take steps for their closure.

Consequently, Original Application No. 358/2019 and Original Application No. 440/2019 stand disposed of, with no order as to cost.
